

TITLE

Title I provides financial support to schools that serve a high percentage of low-income students. This funding aims to ensure equitable access to a high-quality education for all children. Schools may apply these funds toward supplementary instructional materials and professional development initiatives.

TITLE II

Title II allocates resources to support exceptional teaching and leadership within educational institutions. These funds are available for professional development programs that benefit teachers, principals, and district leaders.

TITLE III

Title III funding aims to improve English language proficiency and academic success for English Learners by providing supplemental services. These funds can be allocated for extra instructional materials or professional development specifically designed to support English Learners.

TITLE IV

Title IV is a versatile grant intended to be customized to meet the comprehensive needs of students. This includes mental and physical health, safety, and a rigorous learning environment that effectively integrates technology. Funds can be directed toward programs and professional development that advances these objectives.

TITLE V

The purpose of Title V is to ensure that all students have access to a well-rounded education, enhance school conditions for effective student learning, and improve the use of technology to boost academic achievement and digital literacy among all students.

IDEA

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) is a federal law providing funding to guarantee that that every eligible child with a disability has access to a free and appropriate public education. Schools are required to offer specialized instruction and services designed to meet the specific needs of these students, at no cost to their families.
